THE RIIO SCHOOL OF OPHTHALMOLOGY HAS SIGNED A SERVICE PROVISION AGREEMENT WITH KIBAGABAGA DISTRICT HOSPITAL AND GASABO DISTRICT, TO PROVIDE COMPREHENSIVE SPECIALIZED EYE CARE SERVICES TO THE COMMUNITY.

THIS IS A MODEL OF PUBLIC PRIVATE PARTNERSHIP FOR IMPROVING ACCESS TO HIGH QUALITY EYE CARE SERVICES IN THE SPIRIT OF UHC, LEAVING NO ONE BEHIND. RIIO PROVIDES THE EYE CARE SPECIALISTS AS WELL AS EQUIPMENT TO RUN A SPECIALIST LEVEL EYE CLINIC. THE CLINIC HAS NOW BEEN UPGRADED FROM A DISTRICT LEVEL

FACILITY TO A REFERRAL CLINIC. PATIENTS USING COMMUNITY HEALTH INSURANCE AS WELL AS OTHER INSURANCES CAN ACCESS HIGH QUALITY SERVICES EASILY NOW.

FOR EXAMPLE THE FIRST EVER DALK CORNEAL TRANSPLANTS WERE PERFORMED AT DECEMBER 2020.

Q1. RIIO RUNS THE FIRST AND ONLY OPHTHALMOLOGY RESIDENCY PROGRAM IN RWANDA. HOW IS IT GOING?

ANSWER: THE PROGRAM IS NOW IN ITS THIRD YEAR AND WE HAVE 10 RESIDENTS ENROLLED FROM RWANDA, BURUNDI AND DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC OF CONGO. OUR THIRD YEAR ARE SLOWLY BUT SURELY BECOMING COMPETENT CLINICIANS AND ARE CURRENTLY IN GUINEA DOING AN INTENSIVE CATARACT SURGERY COURSE AT CADESSO*. THIS MODEL OF SOUTH TO SOUTH COOPERATION IS SOMETHING WE CHERISH

Q2. HOW EASY OR DIFFICULT HAS IT BEEN TO START A PROGRAM FROM SCRATCH?

ANSWER: OUR INTERACTIONS WITH EXISTING PROGRAM DIRECTORS THROUGH THE COECSA HAS HELPED US GREATLY N THIS JOURNEY. THE RIIO DIRECTORS BRING THE BEST FROM THEIR OWN EXPERIENCES AS TRAINEES AT UNIVERSITY OF NAIROBI AND WITS. THE NETWORKS THEY HAVE MADE OVER THE YEARS HAS HELPED US FILL IN OUR GAPS IN OUR RESOURCES AND NUMBER OF FACULTY. NOTABLE IS OUR PARTNERSHIP WITH FONDAZIONE LEONARDO DEL VECCHIO, FRED HOLLOWS FOUNDATION, HIMALAYAN CATARACT PROJECT, CBM AND WILLSEYE CENTRE FOR ACADEMIC GLOBAL OPHTHALMOLOGY. THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH RWANDA REMAINS OUR MOST ENDURING SUPPORTER AND WE WANT TO FULFIL OUR PROMISE OF PRODUCING EXCELLENT OPHTHALMOLOGISTS TO FILL IN THE GAPS IN THE COUNTRY.

RIIO RESEARCH

WITH SUPPORT FROM ORBIS INTERNATIONAL, WE ARE GEARING UP TO PERFORM THE FIRST RANDOMIZED TRIAL USING ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE FOR DIABETIC RETINOPATHY SCREENING IN THE REGION. THE STUDY HAS ALREADY ATTAINED ETHICS APPROVAL AND ALSO BEEN REGISTERED WITH THE PAN AFRICAN CLINICAL TRIALS REGISTRY (PACTR). THIS STUDY IS IMPORTANT BECAUSE USING ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE TO GRADE RETINA IMAGES AT THE POINT OF DIABETES CARE WOULD ALLOW THE ROLE OUT OF A NATIONAL SCREENING PROGRAM IN A COUNTRY WITH VERY FEW EYE SPECIALISTS TO EXAMINE ALL THE PATIENTS WITH DIABETES AND WITH NO READING CENTRE TO INTERPRET RETINA IMAGES. THE STUDY WILL LOOK NOT ONLY AT THE PERFORMANCE OF THIS MODEL BUT ALSO HOW RECEIVING IMMEDIATE GRADING IMPACTS PATIENT SATISFACTION AND UPTAKE OF REFERRAL TO EYE CLINICS.
