DESPITE COVID 19 PANDEMIC, RWANDA INTERNATIONAL INSTITUTE OF OPHTHALMOLOGY(RIIO) CONTINUED IMPLEMENTATION OF PROGRAM ACTIVITIES THROUGH DIFFERENT PILLARS IN THE YEAR 2021:

I. EDUCATION AND TRAINING

- Through South-South cooperation model, RIIO sent 4th Year Residents to CADESSO in GUINEA-CONAKRY where they have greatly benefited from the Small Incision Cataract surgery Course in CADESSO.
- All 10 Residents in PGY 3 and 4 received completion certificates from COECSA and ICO for OPTICS, REFRACTION and VISUAL SCIENCES
- In November 2021 a new batch of 4 Residents started PGY 1 among them 2 Rwandans and 2 Kenyans (2 women and 2 men)
- 4 Visiting lecturers from USA participated in teaching, clinical and outreach activities at RIIO (Dr Omair, Dr Myres, Dr Eliza and Dr DUAA)
- All 10 Residents are pursuing 6 months rotations at different electives sites:
 DAEH exposing them to more diagnostic and specialty surgery, at RMH and Kabgayi Eye Clinic to see how a referral set up works, through their base at kibagabaga they are understanding how to run a district level eye clinic

II. COMMUNITY ACTIVITIES

In just over one year we completed 10000 consultations and 365 surgeries at the new Kibagabaga clinic.

Cataract Outreach Program

In 2021 we provided outreach surgery in 4 underserved clinics at Butaro, Nyamata, Kinihira and Kiziguro Hospitals.

Cornea transplantation at RIIO

• In partnership with Cornea-Help – an organization based out of Wiesmoor, Germany, RIIO through his Director Professor John Nkurikiye Chief Consultant Ophthalmologist and Cornea specialist, assisted by RIIO Residents performed Cornea Transplant surgeries at the RIIO-Kibagabaga Community Eye Clinic. In 2021 the total of 13 deserving recipients among them 7 Children and 6 Young people restored hope for the future.










- In partnership with Orbis International, RIIO completed the first Randomised Controlled Trial using artificial intelligence for diabetic retinopathy, a first for our region.
